



TE AWAMUTU COLLEGE POLICY STATEMENT ON GIFTED AND TALENTED STUDENTS

Rationale

- 1. To identify students with special abilities, to act as catalysts to their gifts and to provide opportunities for them to develop and display their talents.
- 2. To ensure that the needs of all gifted and talented students are met irrespective of gender, ethnicity, socio-economic background or physical disability.
- 3. To give clear direction in terms of identification, monitoring, teaching methodology, resources, opportunities and evaluation.
- 4. To provide suitable professional learning and development and resources for teachers.

Guidelines

- 1. A GATE team (led by a Lead Teacher) will be formed each year. (All curriculum areas will be represented).
- 2. Lead Teacher, together with staff, have developed a suitable identification process and opportunities for Gifted and Talented students. A GATE Register will be maintained and accessible for staff to view.
- 3. The GATE Team will develop credible, manageable and flexible structures to support Gifted and Talented students.
- 4. Professional Learning and Development opportunities (internal and external) will be utilised.
- 5. External opportunities for Gifted and Talented students as well as teaching staff will be actively sought to enhance the programme.
- 6. The opportunities (internal and external) for GATE students will be reviewed annually and outcomes reported to the Board.
